In this film it can be found the characters of Kakamora that in pacific culture mean as the little creatures that live in the caves and forest or it can be personification as the guard of the forest. Besides, it can be found that nature is revealed in this film. In the beginning of screenplay shows that several times Moana tries to go to the ocean and every time she tried to approach the ocean, her parents brought her back and reminded her of her duties and her people were the most appropriate place where she should be.
